Operation of the Computer and Information Technology Council

(CINTEC) after 15th April 1984.

As requested by Your Excellency during our recent meetings at Nuwara Eliya, I have summarized below, the minimum steps required for the Computer and Information Technology Council (CINTEC) to be brought into operation after 15th April 1984 (as approved by Cabinet on 28th March 1984):

1. Budget for 1984: As directed by Your Excellency, I have prepared abudget in consultation with Mr. Marikar. The attached request for Rs. 265,000/- was transmitted to the Treasury by Mr. Menikdiwela on 5th April 1984. It provides for a skeleton operating group of six persons (Chairman, 3 professional and 2 secretarial staff), plus the minimum office infrastructure. Preliminary feedback from the Treasury indicates that this mini budget would be approved. This will permit CINTEC to operate on a limited scale sufficient to deal with high priority matters during 1984, and is consistent with the views expressed by Cabinet.

Full scale activities of CINTEC would be possible only in 1985 when the Treasury could provide a much bigger budget, permitting the recruitment of more staff and the appointment of the entire Council. The 1985 budget is being prepared, in time, for submission by June 1984, through the normal budget process.

- 2. Office Space: Several alternatives are being looked into and a recommendation will be made shortly.
- 3. Appointment of a Chairman: This should be done early. Your Excellency may recall that exactly one year ago you approved the Computer Policy (COMPOL) Report in Nuwara Eliya and directed me to implement it. This initial mandate would be essentially complete with CINTEC coming into operation after 15th April 1984. I am therefore reluctant to take further major steps relating to CINTEC, since this may appear to be unduly presumptuous. It would be advisable if these activities were launched by the prospective Chairman of CINTEC -- to be appointed by Your Excellency, as soon as possible, under Section 4, Sub-section (2)
